

STEP UP: This is a reminder that communication to families who will be receiving Step Up for Students Pro Rated Funding and not receiving 100% of Step-Up awards may be necessary. As per page 7 of the 2023-24 FES-EO and FTC Parent/Guardian Handbook, Prorated awards after the August 1, Deadline are at 75% or less. The additional tuition owed is to be paid by the family (child). For schools that have not made them aware of the obligation and not updated the FACTS billing, it is advised that you do so prior to the end of the school year. This will allow them time to make up the difference. *Please note that if* schools think they are owed more, they can add them to the form that should come to schools in a couple of weeks (as per Lauren May).
